The Custodes Libertatis Memorial Foundation concluded a successful third year of support for the children of fallen Naval Academy alumni. Over three dozen donors teamed up to assist five student scholars this year in preparatory, undergraduate, graduate and doctoral programs. These educational scholarship tuition grants are available to the children of graduates of the United States Naval Academy who have lost their lives in combat against the enemies of the United States of America, as a result of Military Training, in the line of United States Department of Defense Duty, as a direct result of their service in the United States Intelligence Community, Law Enforcement Agency, Emergency Medical Services, or as a First Responder, in the period following September 11th, 2001. The Foundation is an American tax-exempt 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded to provide these grants to the children.*

The Custodes Libertatis Memorial Foundation is not legally affiliated with the United States Naval Academy or the United States Naval Academy Foundation, and is a separate and distinct legal entity, organized around a single mission.
